
Key Principles for Using Activities

- Ensure continuity





Clarification: Life-Line

- Horizontal line represents a person's life from birth to present day
- Vertical lines represent significant events
- Cross points (where the vertical lines that intersect with the horizontal line) often connect to losses

Integration: Safety Net

- To identify and explore persons of importance to them.
- To explore the support and security that other people can provide to the youth.
- Help otherwise reluctant children or youth identify and express their feelings.

Integration: Divide Your Life in Thirds

- Provides a context for talking about relationships
- Acknowledges the difficult and sometimes adult-like experiences that youth may have endured
- Recognizes the resiliency and provides a sense of hope for the future

Developing Identity

- Family
- Culture
- Development

Separation and Loss

- Loss of loved ones
- Loss of control in decision
- Loss of dignity and feelings of embarrassment, shame, and guilt
- Loss of identity
- Loss of security, cohesiveness and belongingness in their family



Experiences of Trauma

- •Growing up without trauma provides predictability and consistency
- Traumatic experiences cause feelings of crisis, being out of balance



Loyalty in Families

- Represents attachment and trust in relationships
- Promotes a sense of belonging

7 Skill Elements • Establishing the perception of SAFETY • Providing OPPORTUNITIES to EXPLORE feelings and life events • Be Present • Listen • Buring PRESENT to the individual • LISTENING to the stories • Affirm • Affirm • Briefly Speaking • Recognizing Behaviors • RECOGNIZING and ACCEPTING that current BEHAVIORS reflect GRIEF RESPONSES
